

Lead Pastor Report

The Lord said [to Elijah, the prophet], "Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by. Then a great and powerful wind tore the mountains apart and shattered the rocks before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake came a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire. And after the fire came a gentle whisper. When Elijah heard it, he pulled his cloak over his face and went out and stood at the mouth of the cave." (1 Kings 19:11-13)


In looking back at a year and trying to reflect on where God has been present, it is tempting to believe that the big things are where God most shows himself. And, to be sure, we did have some "big" and exciting things happen during 2016. Our Easter service at École secondaire Le Caron had a great crowd. Our Advent and Christmas services had a great number of visitors hear the message of Jesus - perhaps for the first time. I believe that God was certainly present during those times together. But Elijah discovered that it is often in the still, small voice - unseen by most and difficult to discern by those closest to it - that God is most present. I believe that most of the ways that God worked among us during 2016 were these quiet ways. 2015 was a year of transition at Covenant. As one person described it, the ship got rocky for a time! 2016 was a year for things to settle down. For us to regain our bearings, to ensure that our course was still set for True North, and to settle in for the next stage of this journey we share together. Many of the areas for celebration over the past year are encompassed in other reports, but I want to bring particular attention to a couple of things.

 Refugee Family Sponsorship - In 2015 we began considering whether or not God was calling us to sponsor a refugee family from Syria. As financial commitments came in, it seemed God was confirming this call and we began to work with Mennonite Central Committee to bring a family here to Penetanguishene. After many hours of labour, led by Elise Robitaille and Sean Ouellet, an apartment was rented, furnished and stocked with food to welcome the Hourieh family to their new home. You can read more details in the sponsorship team report, but I want to celebrate what God has done through the many volunteers (from both inside and outside Covenant) and in the lives of many of the volunteers. We have had the opportunity to represent Jesus, not only to the Hourieh family, but to other people in the community as we have worked alongside them. And God has been at work in the lives of Covenant people as we have supported the Houriehs. It hasn't always been an easy ride supporting a family as they adjust to a new language, cultures, and customs. Offers of generosity have not always been received well. Those who have continued to support and befriend the family have learned about patience and grace. God has used our service to form us more and more into Jesus people - loving, even when it is sometimes hard to do so. It is so exciting to see how God has worked in the lives of so many people through our obedience to him.



New to the 2017 Support Services Budget:

 Increase in Building [Repairs and Maintenance] to accommodate for necessary upcoming repairs/renovation (such as new carpeting on the lower level; potential furnace repair or replacement; replacing other stairs at the portables; repairing drainage issues)




Notes regarding 2017 Staff expenses:


- Pastor Jon's salary and benefits are set by BIC Canada
- This will be the first year that we will be returning to having a Children's Ministry Director on staff (2016 was on contract).
 We have increased the rate of pay to correspond with BIC Canada's recommended starting point for ministry directors.
- The proposal for all other staff is a 1.5% cost of living increase, in line with provincial estimates for 2017

BIC & Mission Expenses (Co-operative Ministries):

This money is our participation with BIC Canada and BIC Canada Global. The total of these expenses are set (by recommendation of BIC Canada) at 10% of our offerings.

New to the 2017 Program Budget:

- Pastoral Care/Leadership Development budget of \$2,000 to help invest in and develop volunteer leaders.
- VBS Student Lead Team budget of \$2,000 towards honouraria, for members of our VBS student leadership team.
- Some budget lines have corresponding income lines, which combine for a net budget amount.

Lead Pastor Report (Continued)

• Emotionally Healthy Spirituality - Last fall we had a group of about fourteen people go through a course called Emotionally Healthy Spirituality. Through it God began to do a special work in the lives of some individuals. It was hard work, for sure, as we were invited to consider some deep places we have tended to avoid or ignore in order to maintain the illusions that everything was okay. But it was in those hard places where we were encouraged to meet with God. We were invited to discover that God offers us his immeasurable love and grace even in - especially in - those places that we struggle to love ourselves. Only in acknowledging our brokenness can we begin to find healing. Only in letting go of our false peace, can we truly find the peace Jesus offers. Through the practices of the daily offices and coming together to reflect on the heart of God, we opened ourselves up to God's healing touch in our lives. I don't want to pretend that this course "fixed" anyone or that things are perfect for everyone who takes an eight week course! The course is really an introductory primer to a beautiful, lifelong journey of discovering all that we can be in Jesus and walking closely with him.

The most significant work of 2016 has been not been through the running of specific programs. It has been in the lives of individuals. I believe God has been at work in special ways in many people's lives at Covenant. Some who haven't been here for a long time have reengaged and been embraced. Restoration has begun in other people's lives. The Healer of Souls is at work among us. As we move into 2017, I believe that God intends to continue his work among us. I don't believe that God wants us to settle for less that the abundant life he offers us. So how do we embrace that life? It starts being captured by just how much God loves us and wants us to thrive. Evangelical Christians talk about "giving our life to Jesus" and "asking Jesus into our heart." While these aren't totally wrong pictures, they are incomplete. We are to give our lives to Jesus in order to align with the one who gave his life up for us.

God is for us. God is for you.

And more than simply asking Jesus into our heart, we need to respond to God's invitation and work as he aligns our hearts with his. As we move through 2017, I want that to be more and more true for me, for you, and for us as a church.

There are some specific things I would love for our church to do in during 2017.

- I want to continue to share the principles of Emotionally Healthy Spirituality with more people. I am also looking forward to introducing the parallel course, Emotionally Healthy Relationships. These courses carry the potential to be transformative for us as we deepen our levels of personal wholeness in relationship with God and each other.
- During 2017 I would like us to work alongside BIC Canada Global to re-engage in international partnerships. As our world becomes an increasingly global community, I would like us to discern a place within the global BIC family that we could work with and serve forthe sake of the kingdom.

Lead Pastor Report (Continued)

- We want to continue to invest in the children and youth those who are a part of Covenant and those in the community we are privileged to meet.
- We are planning several fellowship events, some for all ages and some for specific age groups.
- We want to continue to improve our communication.
- Our deacons want to continue to find better ways to connect with and support you on your journey.
- We want to take advantage of Easter and Christmas seasons to provide compelling opportunities for you to invite your friends and family to come to church and discover Jesus.

There is a lot we want to do in the year to come. But more than what we do, it is my prayer that we will discover more of Jesus and the life he invites us into. Every Sunday I pray that we will hear a little more clearly about who God is. As we gather in house churches throughout the week, I hope our conversations focus on encouraging each other to live out the way of Jesus in our world. As we dig into the deepest parts of ourselves in Emotionally Healthy Spirituality, I long for us to discover the infinite love and grace of Jesus and be freed from what is holding us back. And as we discover freedom, we want to walk with you as you discover just how fearfully and wonderfully made you are and help you share the light of Jesus in ways that reflect your as uniqueness.

So what do I ask of you? Simply put, I ask you to join me in this journey. It takes courage. Courage to let go of things you've been holding on to. Courage to be vulnerable. Courage to consider gifts and opportunities you've never dreamed of. Courage that I sometimes struggle to have. That's part of why we need each other! It is not always easy. Truthfully, I had to be broken before I truly began to move past "religion" and "ritual" into the abundant life Jesus offers. It can be hard, but it is worth it. Will you walk this road with me, and with the rest of the brothers and sisters at Covenant?

My prayer for us in 2017 and beyond is not original with me. St. Paul wrote this almost 2000 years ago, but this is my prayer:

For this reason I kneel before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name. I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.

Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.



- Repairs & Maintenance Necessary emergency repairs and work needed to be done through the year. (e.g. rebuilding the entrance to the youth portable after it collapsed, and dealing with flooding in the church basement.)
- Children's Ministry We began using a three year curriculum and had extra expenses related to visual aids. These will not be recurring expenses.
- Cooperative Ministries We missed a payment in 2015 and made fulfilled our 2015 commitments to our BIC Canada family in 2016.
- **Discipleship Ministry** The \$588 overspending in this area was made up for by money given into miscellaneous revenue to cover resources.
- Outreach Events & Ads There is a great explanation for this, which I will get to you as soon as I get the information from our financial people!
- Vacation Bible School Early in 2016, the board approved an unbudgeted honouraria for a team of youth to help lead our VBS.

This year we opted to forego the plants and instead set out candles that could be lit in remembrance of any person missed this year; either a recent or distant loss. Both those participating in the candlelighting and those observing were deeply touched. It helped many acknowledge a missed loved one, and help put meaning into a difficult Christmas. Thanks to Nathaniel Fisher-Hilton for his guitar accompaniment during the lighting of candles.

Neither Ted nor I will be serving as deacons this coming year, but I have a dream for the new deacon board of 2017: I have a dream that you will support our pastor well with your attendance at meetings and your diligence to your responsibilities. I have a dream that you will look back to the way things have been done in the past and learn from them; to glean all the good and eschew the things that are no longer necessary. I have a dream that you will look forward to new and better ways to serve our congregation. I dream that you will have an open mind and listen to each other. TREASURER'S REPORT FOR 2016

I would like to start my report by thanking Dave Webster, Brad Fisher, Nancy Durst and Wilfried Hahn for all their advice and guidance through my first year as treasurer, their wisdom and patience have been appreciated. It was great to see 2016 being a year of stability after having 2015 as a year of many changes and uncertainties. There was a full calendar year with Pastor Jon, the decision of having a permanent youth director, hiring a permanent children director and implementations of a new accounting software program and new website.

We did not meet our 2016 budget on the income side. But we were able to spend money very carefully and make up for missing our 2015 final payment of \$8,700 in Cooperative Ministries. Because of this payment, we show a shortfall of \$6,752, but without it would have achieved a surplus of \$1,948. After extensive discussions and the town hall meeting held in December of 2016, the board has decided to present a financial budget for 2017 as reflected in the statement attached. To accommodate for changes in ministries and streamline for accounting purposes, there have been some technical changes in the categories of expenditure figures this year.

I believe this budget will continue to provide stability and growth for 2017. There are increases in expenses in key areas for growth in our ministries and for essential maintenance of the church while having a slight increase in annual giving's from the previous year. Something to wish for in 2017 is a creation of a finance team that would help in ensuring timely and accurate reporting of the finances throughout the year and in putting together a budget for the following year.

I would like to say a big thank you to our church board, especially Pastor Jon, for their continued support this year. And to all the ministry/department leaders for their efforts in providing a budget for this year. Let's pray for them to spend the allocated funds wisely.





Designated Fund Summary




Usher/Welcome Report

Water Street Outreach

This year has been an exciting year at the Water St. Home for specialized care. Covenant began attending every other week to sing from song books to try and spread joy there to the residents at the request of one of the staff about 3 years ago. She regularly prayed for the clients there and listened to Christian music and preaching on the radio also. She retired in September leaving a big prayer void and godly presence there.

This year we've had two new people come out from Covenant and we regularly have a guitarist, which attracts more residents as well as more of the men. There are currently 21 residents and we have an average of 8 residents participating and 3-4 just listening.

I think the residents would say their highlights are when we mess up and start laughing or on any special event possible, we host a party with all kinds of snacks, complete with T-shirts on Canada day and Timmy's gift cards at Christmas. A big highlight is leaving after a night when a resident who rarely speaks opens up or says hi or stops to chat out in the community and asks excitingly when we are coming back. One of the singers biggest highlights was at Christmas time a resident asked for us to sing "Good King Wenceslas" but we didn't have the words. One Covenant singer recited the entire song having memorized years ago. Let me tell you it has many verses to remember! When she was done, she paused and repeated the last verse for emphasis for us to pay attention to; "Therefore Christian men, be sure Wealth or rank possessing, You who now will bless the poor, Shall yourselves find blessing". The unanimous comment shared was that we go there to try and bring joy to the residents who do not have a very easy or joyful life and we in turn leave there feeling blessed to have seen them smile and laugh and share their burdens or triumphs too.

Our wishes and prayer needs there this year is to update and add newer music, grow in numbers and grow and deepen in our relationships there to continue to spread joy by being Jesus' hands and feet there. We pray For God's strong presence there to comfort and guide when the clients are struggling and for a godly staff to rise up to take the others place. In the words of Good King Wenceslas we want to continue to bless "the poor" and truly find blessing. If you are having difficulty finding any significance or purpose in your days and want to feel that you've made a difference in someone life, we suggest you come out a few times to be a blessing, but in turn be blessed.
